

Good afternoon everyone.

I would like to extend a warm welcome to Jamie Crellin, his Three Bridges management team, board and supporters.

We are looking forward to a return to the league programme with back-to-back fixtures, it feels ages since we last played in this competition, the 1-0 win against Hythe in mid September which left us in a reasonably good position.

Since then we have been involved in three cup competitions, and we set ourselves a target to stay in at least one of them. We did that by earning a well deserved victory at Ramsgate in the Velocity Cup and the third round draw this week paired us at home to Cray Valley PM later this month.

I feel the FA Trophy defeat against Leatherhead was a missed opportunity. We were 1-0 up, playing so well when out of nowhere, from our own corner, they went on a counter attack, won a penalty and we lost Ryan Sawyer to a red card.

That put us in a very difficult position and we lost the game in the course of one action, having been in good control - but we still stayed in it very well, despite playing with 10 men for so long.

We finished with eight outfield players after sending on Liam Northwood as a striker and we could have even got a draw if we hadn't missed the best chance of the game. Then it was Beckenham in the Kent Senior Cup, a third meeting with them in the space of a month which was very strange. Our performance mirrored the other two - we started well and should have been 1-0 up but they scored first. The second came from a dubious refereeing decision, which I thought he could have managed better and the third came in the space of 14 minutes.

We have moved on from there and we welcome Three Bridges today. They had an incredible season last year, and although they have had a challenging start, I feel they are due to start a run soon, and we don't want to be ones to trigger it.

It's going to be a tough game, but one we are looking forward to. Let's hope we are in the bar later celebrating three points.



Beckenham Town

Three goals in 14 first half minutes sent Oaks out of the DFDS Kent Senior Cup at the hands of Beckenham Town.

The third chapter in the triiology ended in a 3-0 home defeat - like the previous two - all played in the space of a month.

Oaks started well, creating two good chances, Gael Kileba going close and Ayomide Majekudunmi foiled by Becks keeper Vinnith Murugamoorthy.

Henry Griffin fired Bdcls in front after 25 minutes and doubled the lead three minutes later following a quickly taken free-kick.

Liam Northwood tipped Jamarie Brissett's effort over the bar, but was picking the ball out of the net again five minutes later as Becks top scorer rifled home another set-piece from the edge of the area.

Jordan Perrin replacing Northwood between the posts at halftime tested several times as in worsening conditions, and heavy rain falling.

Oaks kept plugging away - James Jeffrey fired wide from close range, before substitute Jefferson Aibangbee saw his effort tipped over by Murugamoorthy, before pulling one back deep into stoppage-time.

Three Bridges FC: History

Founded in 1901, Three Bridges joined the Mid Sussex Football League in 1902 and were Champions of that League for the first time in the 1907/08 season. Their first major success came in 1933/34, when they won the Sussex Junior Cup, and sundry other minor honours came their way before they joined the Sussex County Football League in 1952/53, and two years later were crowned Second Division Champions.

In 1962/63 they won the Division Two Invitation Cup and in 1968/69, 1973/74 and 1979/80 were Second Division Runners Up. 1970/71 produced an against the odds triumph when winning the League's Invitation Cup against Southwick (3-2). The 1980s heralded a run of successes, starting with reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase for the first time in 1981/82 before losing at Molesey (1-2). A season later they made it to the last 32 but also won the Sussex RUR Charity Cup for the first time, beating Hastings Town 3-2. Another year on saw them finish runners up in the Thorn EMI National six-a-side tournament, winning a set of floodlights. 1985/86 saw them finish as County League Division One runners up, a feat they repeated in both 1987/88 (when they also won the RUR Cup again) and 1988/89.

A fire destroyed their clubhouse in 1993 which re-focused their priorities and ultimately resulted in relegation in 1996/97. They won the Division 2 League Cup a season later and then finished runners up in Division 2 to regain Division 1 status. They were RUR Cup runners up in 2003/04 and then winners of that same prestigious trophy in 2007/08.

In season **2010/11** hopes were high when they started by winning their first nine League games, but even-

tually finished the season in 5th place. However they did win the John O'Hara League Challenge Cup for the first time that season, beating Rye United 2-1, a tremendous feat that they achieved again in 2011/12, this time AFC Uckfield being defeated 2-1. It looked like being another tough League campaign when they lost four of the first nine matches, but then lost only one of the remaining 29 games, which was concluded by beating Championship rivals Rye United 1-0 at home on the final day of the season! This tremendous run meant the club had achieved its ambition and become Sussex County Football League Champions. With a superb run in the FA Vase too, losing in the last 32 on a penalty shoot out with Derbyshire side, Gresley FC, the 2011/12 'Double' season had undoubtedly been the best in Three Bridges' history.

Their first season in the Ryman Isthmian Football League South Division saw them struggle for much of the time. However, having been 10 points adrift at the bottom of the table in mid February, they went on a run of 11 matches that produced 7 victories, 2 draws and just 2 defeats, earning them Team of the Month Awards in both March and April as a result. It meant that they survived the drop, but their second season in the Ryman League saw them struggle at times again but some key signings midway through the season helped them to 19th place.

The **2014/15** season saw an even greater improvement with a healthy mixture of youth and experience guiding them into 7th position and, whilst they were happy to score 94 League goals, they were less than happy about the 95 they conceded! They improved their defensive record

in conceding 67 goals in season **2015/1**6 but only scored 59, hardly helped by long-term injuries to strike partners Allan Tait and Tony Garrod. With 66 points, they slumped to 14th position, although they only accumulated 6 points fewer than in the previous campaign!

Bridges maintained most of that season's squad for the 2016/17 campaign. However, with at least 11 first team players out injured by September, they had to use a lot of the U21s, Academy and U18s players and by November had lost 12 games in a row, drew three and won just one game. Towards the end of the season, they strengthened the squad but it was too late to avoid relegation.

For the **2017/18** season, Bridges kept a few of the best of the players from the previous season and strength-

ened the team with more experienced players in the hope of promotion once again. Having dispensed with the services of Simon Wormull, Paul Hammond and Danny Lee from the coaching team and folding the Academy team, Bridges also strengthened the

management team with the additions of the experienced ex-Bridges player, Martin Dynan as Assistant Manager, and UEFA 'A' licensed Coach, Marc Wardley.

That season turned out to be an extremely tough one with every team wanting to beat us. However, Bridges accomplished what they set out to do by gaining promotion back to the Isthmian League having finished second place in the Southern Combination League Premier Division, just one point behind the winners, Haywards Heath Town, and despite having only lost 3 games all season.

After serving 25 years with the Club as a manager, Paul Faili stood down as First Team Manager for the 2018/19 season in order to concentrate on his role as Club Chairman. and handed the management reins over to Martin Dynan, assisted by Liam Collins alongside Keith George. He also recruited a new U23s manager in Oliver Saunders, another UEFA 'A' licensed coach, to work closely with the First Team in developing both the U23s and U18s. After losing 8 out of 12 League games by the end of November, as well as being knocked out of all four cup competitions (FA Cup, FA Trophy, League Cup and Sussex Senior Cup), the future looked bleak for Martin Dynan.

However, the team then went on an unbeaten run in December, earning Martin the League's Manager of the Month Award. Unfortunately, that didn't last and Martin's demise was inevitable by the end of February, having lost 8 of the last nine games

with relegation looming. Paul Faili stepped in for the remaining 9 games of the season attaining 4 wins, 2 draws and 3 losses – enough for a 14th place finish and 14 points clear of relegation.

Paul remained as Manager, ably assisted by Keith George and coached by Jamie Crel-

lin who played for the Ćlub for five seasons, but sadly had to hang up his boots after sustaining an ankle injury early in the 2018/19 season, after making 164 appearances for the Club.

For the 2020/2021 season, the only change was a new manager for the U23s (Development Squad) with Ryan Gayler appointed as Manager and Tom Hayward becoming Vice Chairman.

2021/22 saw Jamie Crellin taking over as First Team Manager, with both Danny Lee and Lee Cole (former Academy manager and coach) returning to the club to join Jamie in the dugout as assistant manager and First Team coach respectively.

They trailed 3-0 in the opening 20 minutes against the Tunbridge Wells visitors - last season's defending champions - before conceding a fourth.

Under-18 youngster Elliot Hayward

capped a good debut with one of Oaks' goals - the other was an own goal - as they pulled two back, only to concede a fifth before the end. Manager Steve McGinn said: "Positive for me was Eliot - best player on the pitch."

Back with Aibangbee



Jefferson Aibangbee is back scoring goals having recovered from a serious injury suffered nearly twelve months ago. He scored in our two previous home games against Beckenham Town and Leatherhead taking him to six for the season. Playing for Faversham against Sheppey last November, he suffered a broken fibula and ligament damage.

He recalls the moment it happened, reflects on his recovery, and linking up again with Marcel here at Sevenoaks.

"I was on the halfway line, received the ball and ran through the middle, the player came across me and caught my trailing leg, and it just snapped.
"I looked at it, and thought I am in trouble here, my leg was the other way - and it was broken.

"It was a long time being out and it was so hard, so I am very grateful to be back playing again - thank God.

"I have gone through everything, - the pain and trauma - wanting to get back playing, so i am grateful for that and sharing the pitch with some of the players who were there when it happened."

"The injury) mean't I didn't have a good pre-season because I didn't have many games, because I was recovering in terms of my rehab, and trying to get fit.
I joined Sevenoaks at the start of the season and I am grateful to Marcel for giving me the chance - allowing me to take my time - getting 20 minutes here and 20 minutes there, building it up and finally getting confident and getting back to basics."
