




The chairman

Sevenoaks Town Women's first team began their pre-season last Sunday as they welcomed Ebbsfleet Women FC at home.

Ebbsfleet play in the fifth tier of the women's football pyramid, a strong opposition to test the women's team. A high press saw Ebbsfleet finish the first half 3-0 up but Sevenoaks held strong and the game finished 4-1 with lots to learn from playing such a higher opposition. Our goal came from Lily Hewitt. Sevenoaks Town continue to have two teams for the 2024/25 season. Our First team stay in the Premier Division of the South East Counties Women's Football League for a third season, looking to push into the top half of the table. They will also be joined by newly promoted Cray Wanderers, Tonbridge

Angels and Kings Hill, all of which the side will face this preseason. The First team continues to be managed by Dan Thomas with a coaching team including Matt Orchin and Jeremy Parsons. Our Development squad welcomes several of last seasons U16 girls who joined training with the women's team through the previous season, many of which looking ahead to their first season in women's football.

The Development team will also be joined by John Wood who was previously assistant coach for our Ul6s. They continue in Division 2 of the South East Counties Women's Football League alongside local side Ide Hill. Our First team continue their preseason campaign as they welcome newly promoted Kings Hill at home on Sunday 4th August at 2:30pm at The Bourne Stadium.



The reserve revival

Steve McGinn says reviving a reserve team at the club has taken a long time but that it's well worth all the hard work. It was six months ago when he approached chairman Paul Lansdale and is now preparing for the start of the new season competing in the Sevenoaks League Premier Division which begins next month.

He explained how it all happened. "I had a bunch of players who we wanted to move to play at a higher level. "Paul liked the idea, I looked at a couple

of other clubs in the area, but coming to Sevenoaks I thought we could involve

youngsters here.

"I must also thank Paul for all his help, tlme and advice."

He added: "We had a good core, but finding players has not been hard, we had about 70 at trials, then worked on narrowing things down to get to our final squad.

"We are starting in the Sevenoaks League but hope to move up the leagues as quickly as we can.

"Several of the boys have played higher including the Southern Counties East League and KCL Premier Division, but some of the youngsters haven't, it's a real big mix, but they are all good enough."

Whitstable Town: History

The club was established in 1885 and in 1909 joined the Kent League, where they remained for many years, apart from a couple of short spells elsewhere. In the 1996/97 season, the team reached the fifth round of the FA Vase.

They were champions of the Kent League Premier Division in the 2006707 season and were promotedto the Isthmian League. After nine seasons they suffered relegation and played in the Southern Counties East League Premier Division for the next two, but in 2017/18 they won both the Kent SeniorTrophy and League Cup, whilst also finishing runners-up in the legaue, which was enough to gainpromotion back to the Isthmian League, where they are currently members of the South-East Division. Although the first recorded football match in Whitstable was in 1885, the first record of Whitstable Town's existence was the following year. After a couple of years playing in a field behind the railwaystation, the club relocated to The Belmont Ground in 1888 (above right), where they play to this day. In 1909 the Oystermen joined the original Kent League, where they played until it folded in 1959, winning the Division Two title three times.

They also lifted the Kent Amateur Cup (now Kent SeniorTrophy) in 1929. After the collapse of the Kent League, the club played for a while in the AetolianLeague, but this meant long trips to play London teams as opposed to the earlier money-spinningEast Kent derbies, and this was a period of financial struggle for the club, which dropped into theamateur leagues for a number of years.In the late 1960s the Kent League reformed, with the


Oystermen among the founder members moving back from the Greater London League. Trophy success was rare although they did reach cupfinals on several occasions and lifted the Kent League cup in 1979-80 when they beat Chatham 4-3 after extra time, having trailed 3-1 late in the second half. They also attracted national publicity in 1989 when striker Gerry Allen scored a goal after just 4 seconds of a match. A dramatic penalty shootout involving 26 spot kicks brought the Kent Senior Trophy to Whitstable in 2000-01 when VCD were eventually beaten 10-9 on penalties.

Whitstable remained members of the Kent League until their promotion to the Isthmian League in2007. The 2006/07 season marked the best in the club's history when supporter Tony Rouse tookover as chairman from long time servant of the club Joe Brownett. Rouse appointed Marc Seager as the club's manager, taking over from Matt Toms.

Under Marc Seager's leadership theteam won the Kent League and the Kent Senior Trophy.In 2012 former local referee Gary Johnson took over as chairman from Joe Brownett (after his second spell in the chair) who stepped down after many years at Whitstable Town.

The club's best finish in the Isthmian League was eighth under managers Jim and Danny Ward in 2014/15, while NickySouthall led them to the last 32 of the FA Trophy in 2013/14, before losing 2-1 to Ebbsfleet United infront of 742 supporters at the Belmont Ground.

Towards the end of a turbulent 2015/16 season that saw the chairman resign and the club relegated, Joe Brownett again



returned as chairman and Scott Porter took over as Manager for the last few games in the Isthmian League before relegation was confirmed.

The club rebuilt off the pitch and aftertwo seasons in the Southern Counties East Football League, promotion back into the IsthmianLeague was achieved with a second placed finish during a season that also brought cup final wins inthe Kent Senior Trophy and the SCEFL Challenge Cup. The club launched a football academy at the start of the 2017/18 season and then joined togetherwith Whitstable Town Junior Football Club on 1st June 2019, when the club ownership was also transferred to a new limited company. With chairman Joe Brownett and manager Scott Porter bothdeciding to stand down to take up alternative roles within the club, the 2019-20 season heralded a fresh start for Whitstable Town. The junior club chairman Steve Clayton took up the position of overallclub chairman and Llovd Blackman became the new first team manager.

children under the age of eighteen to train, play football and be part of the town's senior club and with a thriving academy and new reserves team, there is a clear pathway to senior football in the town.

Unfortunately, Whitstable finished bottom of the league in the 2021-22 season, despite theefforts of four managers, Lloyd Blackman, Ben Harding (caretaker), Keith McMahon and Andy Drury.

The summer of 2022 saw a major transformation at the club's Belmont Ground, with the installation ofa 3G pitch, together with other ground improvements including new LED floodlights.

The next twoseasons in the SCEFL Premier Division, briefly under Richard Styles and then Marcel Nimani, brought two top six finishes. Jamie Coyle was appointed Whitstable manager in the summer of 2024, withMatt Longhurst and long serving goalkeeper Dan Eason joining the new management team. The club also launched a new brand identity and club crest ahead of the 2024-25 season, as it continues togrow and look forward to an exciting future.
