Eddie Diplock ...

Eddie Diplock "Mr Sevenoaks Town" sadly passed away on Wednesday aged 93.

He served the club as secretary for more than 60 years in a long association with local and county football as a player and administrator - and international football as a volunteer in the media department at Euro 96.

Eddie played football at St John's Church of England School in the town, and St John's United when he left at 14, first working as a telegram boy, before joining South Surburban Gas Compsny as as an apprentice gas engineer - where he stayed for 47 years.

National Service saw him join the Royal Engineers based in England and the Middle East, playing where he was stationed.

On demob he rejoined St John's United who by had amalgamated with Sevenoaks FC to become Sev-enoaks Town.

He played for the first team for 15 years, and continued to turn out for the reserves and A team playing his last game at the age of 56 - justifiably proud of never being cautioned or sent off in a 30-plus year career.

He was appointed secretary in 1953 - before becoming involved with local football -Sevenoaks Charity Cup, Kent Amateur League, then the Sevenoaks League serving as vice chairman then chairman.

In 2003, he received the prestigious Football Association Medal for 50 years service to the game in the town and county.

He was a long serving member of the Sevenoaks Sports Council, Life President of the Kent County League and received a Kent County Football Association Order of Merit following his retirement at the age of 75.

He was elected President of the Sev-enoaks District League and Sevenoaks Charity Cup in 2007, describing it as a "proud honour allowing me to keep



in contact with all the friends I made over the years."

Eddie was honoured in 2012 with an award from The Torch Trophy Trust , a charity who recognises and rewards volunteers in sport and recreation, presented to him by HRH The Duke of Kent.

As well as being club secretary he continued to maintain the two grass pitches here at the club, mowing and marking out the pitch before stepping down in 2015 -with a stand in his name, and being named as Life President.

He was also honoured at the Club Awards Day when he received a letter from the then Football Association chairman Greg Dyke.

Speaking at the time chairman Paul Lansdale said: "Words cannot express the club's thanks and feelings for Eddie.

"He was an amazing man with such a big heart and a wonderful servant to our club."

Erith Town FC: History

Formed in 1956 as Woolwich Town, the Dockers attained senior status in 1995-96 upon reaching the London Spartan League Premier Division in 1995-96.

By then the club had already changed their name to Erith Town, reflecting a move to Erith Stadium. After one year in the Spartan Premier, the Dockers successfully applied to cross the Pyramid to the Kent League.

After struggling in the lower reaches of the League for three seasons, the Dockers celebrated the new Millennium with a then best seventh place in 1999-2000 and reached the London Senior Cup Final, losing 5-1 to Bedford.

In the following seven seasons Erith only once reached such heights again, finishing seventh in 2003-4. The appointment of former Fisher Athletic player Mark Tompkins as player-manager midway through 2006-7 saw an upturn in fortunes and the following season he led the team to fifth in the Kent League. He also brought the club their first silverware as a senior club as record appearance maker Alan Hanlon lifted the Kent League Cup after a 1-0 win over much-fancied Hythe Town in the Final at Folkestone. Tommo's departure on the eve of 2008-9 led to the appointment of Steve O'Boyle who took the Dockers back to the Kent League Cup Final for a second season. Despite drawing 1-1 after extra time against Croydon, the Dockers went down 3-1 on penalties. Tony Russell took over the reins when O'Boyle departed in October 2010 guiding the club to a third successive mid table finish but bringing the Kent Senior Trophy to the club after a 3-1 win over Tunbridge Wells in the Final. Having achieved a new best of fourth

the following season, Russell departed for neighbours VCD Athletic with Erith Town top of the League in November 2012 and after a brief spell with James Collins in charge, Tompkins returned to take the Dockers to new personal best of third spot. Tommo repeated the feat in 2013-14 before departing and a turbulent 2014-15 saw three managers and a Houdini style escape from relegation under Martin and Joe Ford.

Two further seasons of struggle followed before Mark Deveney took over the club in the Summer of 2017, immediately appointing former owner Albert Putnam as President for his work as player, manager and Chairman in over 50 years with the club. On the 26th August the club took part in the last ever game at Brentford's Griffin Park ground, losing 6-3 to the Bees' B team in the London Senior Cup semi-final.

After a fourth placed finish in 2022-23, their best for ten years, the Dockers moved to share with Sporting Club Thamesmead at Bayliss Avenue as they bid to progress on and off the field.

With this in mind the Dockers appointed Kay Deveney as their first female Chair in the Summer of 2023, with Mark Deveney continuing as CEO.

Under their stewardship the club has just experienced the most successful season in their history, finishing with two trophies - the SCEFL Challenge Cup and the Kent Senior Trophy - and winning the SCEFL Play-Off Final which sees The Dockers promoted to the Isthmian League South-East to play football at Step 4 for the first time.

We now look forward to the 2024/25 season with huge optimism.

Perfect start continues

Ellie George and Hannah Cleary scored twice as Oaks first team won 4-1 at Cray Wanderers to make it four wins out of four in the South East Womens League Premier Division.

The victory ended the home club's own perfect start to the season at their new Flamingo Park base - and leaves Oaks second in the table

George took her tally to eight putting Oaks in front on the half hour, before Cleary doubled the lead three minutes after the break.

George made it 3-1 with 23 minutes left, before Cleary rounded things off with a late fourth.

Cray pulled one back deep into stoppage-time.

George's hat-trick sealed the 4-2 home

win over Woodcombe Sports the previous weekend. Natalie Graves added the other.

Oaks visit leaders London Road tomorrow (2pm).

The Development team are going well - and also face a top-two Division 2 West hosting table-toppers Foots Cray Lionesses tomorrow. (2pm)
