
Good afternoon to you all and welcome to everyone connected with Leatherhead for this Emirates FA Cup Preliminary Round tie.

Jordan Perrin interview

Jordan Perrin was named MOM for a string of fine saves to help Oaks start the new league season with an opening day win over Burgess Hill

He tells **ANDREW GIDLEY** about that victory, the build up to the new season, and the chance to reunite with Marcel Nimani after playing under him at Whitstable.

"It was a fantastic way to the start of the season, we all stuck together after being under the cosh in a 20 minute spell when we had to defend.

"I had a bit of work to do in the second half, but that is why Marcel has bought me in.

"The point-blank one you just act on instinct - you are going one way - and then stick out a hand to make the save - I love making them, that's why I am here and why I am a goalkeeper.

"I have really enjoyed my time so far, pre-season was brilliant, I have really got on with the boys, we won our last game at Chipstead 2-1.

"We went 1-0 down but I could see in that game that we were going to sit tight what ever happens this season.

We carried that into the game against Whitstable and then against Burgess Hill - again it was 1-1, then pushing on to get the winner.

You have played under Marcel before at Whitstable?

"I was on holiday in Majorca - and was going to stay there as I hadn't had too many offers.

"I saw Marcel was coming to Sevenoaks, and had things about what they want to build here,

"Then Marcel said to me he wanted me to be his No.1, I jumped at the chance. "I looked at it as a brilliant decision to make, and I am glad to be here. And you have won the Isthmian League South East title before?'

"I got promoted with Herne Bay in 2022 (beating Ashford in the play-off final).
"That squad under Ben Smith was something special, I know it's quite early to

call, but I have got a feeling about what we have got here, and I feel we could do something this season.

"If it's not this season, then hopefully we can improve, keep the squad together for as long as we can and build as a family which I am really looking forward to.



Preliminary Preview

136 – There will be 136 Preliminary Round ties played across the weekend of 16/17/18 August involving 134 clubs from Step 4 and 138 teams from Step 5.

7 – Half of the 14 debutant clubs made it through to the Preliminary Round: Blyth Town, Hamworthy Recreation, lyybridge Town, Millbrook (Hampshire), Newcastle Blue Star, South Liverpool and Larkfield and New Hythe Wanderers, the only one of the seven to be drawn away from home

7 – Seven other clubs are making their first appearance in the Preliminary Rd having won their first ever FA Cup game: Benfleet FC, Boro Rangers, Downham Town, Harleston Town, Hartpury University and Pilkington FC, all in their second campaigns, and Golcar United participating in FA Cup for the third time.

15 – Fifteen clubs are equalling their best ever FA Cup run by reaching the Preliminary Round including Athletic Newham, Broadbridge Heath, Melton Town, Northampton ON Chenecks and Punjab United who have all reached this round for the third time.

10 – Sandhurst Town have made the Preliminary Round again for the first time in ten campaigns. Both Thackley FC and Wellington FC have had nine campaigns since last getting this far.

10– Ten ties will result in the winner either setting or equalling their best FA Cup run with Blyth Town versus Birtley Town the only tie to guarantee the winner will make 1st Qualifying Round for the first time.

24 – The number of ties that involve two clubs that have met in the FA Cup before. The most common tie is Great Yarmouth Town versus Cambridge City who have been drawn together in the FA Cup for the eighth time. Cambridge City have a five to two win ratio in past FA Cup meetings.

72 – Redhill FC has had the longest to wait to avenge a past FA Cup defeat with it being 72 years since they lost 4-2 to this season's Preliminary Round opponents, East Grinstead Town. Conversely, Newport Pagnell Town versus AFC Dunstable and Bideford FC versus Wellington FC are both ties that last happened just last season.

9 – Shifnal Town and Sutton Coldfield Town last met in the FA Cup 41 years ago producing a nine goal thriller won 5-4 by Sutton Coldfield.

30 – There are 30 ties involving clubs that will meet each other in League games this season with Northern Premier League Division One West the most represented with four ties in total.

326 – Grantham Town are participating in the FA Cup for the 115th time and their Preliminary Round tie at Yaxley FC will be th heir 326th FA Cup game, but will be their first against opponents beginning with the letter 'Y'.

The Oaks Report

Marcel Nimani claimed his first Pitching In Isthmian League South East win in charge of Sevenoaks Town with a 3-1 win over Burgess Hill on Saturday - then heaped praise on the beaten opponents.

Pre-match Nimani tipped the Sussex side as a team to watch this season and saw no reason to change his mind despite the victory.

Warren Mfula scored twice against one of his old clubs, and substitute Gael Kileba added the third deep into eight minutes plus of stoppage-tlme.

However it was Oaks goalkeeper Jordan Perrin who proved the star of the show with four second half saves - including three in the space of two minutes - either side of Kieran Rowe's 52nd minute equaliser.

Sammie McCleod shot wide early on, before Mfula fired Oaks in front just before the half hour, went close to a second five minutes before the break, before Danny Divine headed wide

Perrin's big moments came soon after the restart, the best a point-blank stop to deny Oly Davies, even getting a touch on Rowe's equaliser, before pushing away Harry Lawson's fierce effort 14 minutes from time.

Oaks survived before scoring twice late on to seal the points.

Mfula got his second five minutes from time, teed up by Rodney Eruotor's lay-off before substitute

Gael Kileba added the late third after
rounding visiting keeper Slavomir
Huk.

Oaks included two new signings, forward Anthony Adesite - and midfielder Jack Mahoney - back for a second spell.

Numani was checking on the fitness of Devine, (illness) and Mfula, McLeod and Michael Hagan who all picked up knocks in the game. Oaks host Leatherhead in the Emirates FA Cup Preliminary Round tie on Saturday (3pm).

Leatherhead FC: History



Leatherhead FC can trace its history back to the formation of Leatherhead Rose in 1907. Rose were crowned Champions of the Dorking & District League in 1910 and 1919 before joining the Kingston and District League where they won the League title three times, the last in 1938-39.

Leatherhead United were formed in 1924 and, in 1925-6, won Division One of the Sutton and District League. In the early 1930s, United joined the Surrey Junior League becoming Champions in 1933-4.

After the War, officials of the two clubs met and in May 1946, Leatherhead Football Club was officially formed at a public meeting. United's Fetcham Grove ground was to be used as the home ground.

The Tanners went on to win four consecutive Surrey Senior League Championships before spells in the Metropolitan, Delphian and Corinthian Leagues. Tanners were Corinthian League champions in 1963 before moving into the Athenian League. Leatherhead won promotion from Division One at the end of the first season and inaugurated their floodlights with a match against a Fulham side.

Leatherhead won the Surrey Senior Cup for the first, and to date, only time in 1969. After being elected into the Isthmian League, Leatherhead made national headlines in 1974-5 when they reached the Fourth Round proper of the FA Cup, defeating League sides Colchester Utd and Brighton & Hove Albion before bowing out to First Division Leicester City 2-3. In subsequent seasons, the Tanners defeated two more Football League sides at the Grove - Cambridge United and Northampton Town.

After the disappointment of defeat in FA Amateur Cup semi-finals in 1971 and 1974, the Tanners finally reached Wembley Stadium in 1978 but were beaten in the FA Trophy Final. The Club then entered a period of decline and were relegated in 1983 and in 1990, slipped down into Division Two South but were back in Division One in 1997. Finances were a problem and in the summer of 2000, the club was within a few days of folding but was saved by its supporters who took over following a crisis meeting.

In 2006-7. Leatherhead were the lowest ranked team to reach the First Round Proper of the FA Cup, losing

1-2 at Football League side, Torquay United.

Mick Sullivan was appointed First Team Manager in May 2009. Under Sullivan's quidance, the club had its most successful season in years, winning the Isthmian League Cup (the first major trophy for some 40 years) and finishing the season in fifth place in the League before losing a play-off semi-final.

The following season, a dramatic play-off victory against Dulwich Hamlet (4-3 after extra time), saw The Tanners return to the Premier Division for the first time since 1983.

The Tanners' stay lasted just the one season though. In 2013-14 Tanners reached the play offs again, this time edging out Guernsey 3-2, before winning a penalty shootout at Folkestone Invicta to return to the Ryman Premier Division.

Sammy Moore was appointed in the summer of 2017. In his first managerial job Sammy steered Tanners to the second round of the FA Cup, a County Cup Final and a top eight finish in the League before departing for Concord Rangers along with the majority of the team. He was replaced by former

Margate boss Nikki Bull who, despite having to rebuild the squad, took the team to an 8th place finish narrowly missing out on the play-offs.

After a poor start to the 2021-22 season Luke Tuffs was appointed manager in January 2022. but was unable to steer the club out of the relegation places, although from a seemingly impossible position it was verv close.

After an indifferent start to 2022-23 Hayden Bird was appointed to the Fetcham Grove hot seat in October 2022.

Manager - IAN SELLEY - Ian had a successful playing career the highlights being his time at Arsenal where he won the European Cup Winners Cup, F A Cup and League Cup. He went on to play for Fulham and Wimbledon amongst others He worked as head coach at the Arsenal academy in Dubai for 7 years before starting his non-league career at Chertsey Town.

In his time their Town finished 2nd in the league and lost in the play-off final to Hanwell town. He moved to Fetcham Grove in May 2024 from Westfield. Field reached the play offs last season before losing narrowly to eventual winners Marlow.

Assistant Manager – **MICK BENNETT** – Mick has over 30-years-experience as a coach and was previously lan's assistant manager at Chertsey Town and Westfield and is also Academy Coach at Brentford.

Coach – **ADAM PITWOOD** – Adam is a former professional footballer who enjoyed spells at Millwall, Crystal Palace, Nottingham Forest and Fulham whilst also being involved in the England youth set-up, Adam has now transferred his knowledge to the touchline achieving UEFA coaching status Previously 1st team coach at South Park and Westfield.

KENNY BEANEY – Experienced midfielder signed from Kingstonian in December 2022. He has also played and enjoyed success at Merstham, Dulwich Hamlet, Wealdstone, Beckenham, Grays Athletic and Thurrock. Currently sidelined through injury.

NIRAN BUTLER – The 24-year-old defender came through the academy at Barnet and has played for the likes of Staines Town, Sutton Common Rovers, Kingstonian, Maldon & Tiptree and more recently Westfield before joining the Tanners in May 2024.

ANUAR CEESAY – Wide player who is quick, direct and has an eye for goal. Signed from Badshot Lea in the summer of 2024.Previously turned out for Uxbridge and Tooting & Mitcham Utd.

OLLIE COOK - Commanding centre-half signed from Carshalton Athletic in the summer of 2023. Started out with Fulham youth before joining the Southampton Academy. Counts Merstham and Kingstonian among his former clubs.

DEONDRE DATE – Exciting young striker signed in July 2024 on a dual registration deal from National League South side Tonbridge Angels. He spent last season at South Park finding the back of the net fifteen times in all competitions. He was previously a youth player at Sutton United and also played for Bagshot.
