Beckenham Town: History

The original Beckenham Town were established in the late 19th century, affiliating to the Kent County Football Association in **1887.**

In **1923** the club joined Division One of the London League.

They won Division One in 1927–28 and were promoted to the Premier Division. However, after finishing second-from-bottom in their first season in the Premier Division, they ended the 1929–30 season in last place, and were relegated back to Division One.

The following season saw them finish second in Division One, earning promotion back to the Premier

Division. Despite finishing bottom of the Premier Division in 1931–32 they remained in the division, but after repeating the feat in 1932–33, they were relegated back to Division One.

After finishing bottom of Division One in 1934–35 the club left the league. They had also entered a

team into the Kent County Amateur League a few seasons before, and continued playing in the Premier Division of the Western Section until rejoining the London League in **1951**, where they were placed in the Premier Division.

They remained in the London League's Premier Division until joining the Aetolian League in **1961.**

This merged with the London League in **1964** to form the Greater London League, with Beckenham placed in Section B.

A fifth-place finish in the league's inaugural season saw them win a place in the Premier Division for the **1965–66** season. However, after

finishing second-from-bottom of the division that season, they were relegated to Division One. They folded in **1969.**

In **1971** the club was reformed based on the Stanhope Rovers junior team.

After playing in the South East London Amateur League, they joined Division Two of the new London Spartan League in 1975. After being runners-up in 1977–78, they were promoted to the Premier Division. In 1982 they transferred to Division One of the Kent League, which became the Premier Division in 1998.

They finished as runners—up in **2005–06.** The league was subse-

quently renamed the Southern Counties East League in 2013. The club won both the Kent Senior Trophy and the League Cup in 2013–14, and went on to win the Roy Vinter Shield at the start of the 2014–15 season. In 2019–20 the club were top of the league when the season was abandoned due to

the COVID-19 pandemic; this would have been the club's highest finish since reforming in **1971.**

At the end of the **2020–21** season they were transferred to the Premier Division South of the Combined Counties League.

During their first season in the Combined Counties League, Beckenham were Premier Division South champions, earning promotion to the Isthmian League.

In their first season in the Isthmian League the club finished fourth, qualifying for the promotion playoffs. They went on to lose 1–0 to Whitehawk in the semi-finals.

The Oaks Report

An afternoon that started so well ended in disappointing fashion as Oaks exited the Isuzu FA Trophy against Leatherhead

The Surrey side went through 2-1 in the Second Qualifying Round tie, following up their 2-0 success in the FA Cup a month earlier. Jefferson Aibangbee put Oaks in front after 19 minutes finishing well after good work by Rodney Eruotor.

However Oaks lost Jahmal Howlett-Mundle immediately afterwards following an earlier injury, with Sammie McCleod and Oliver Gray forced off after also picking up knocks.

Having used all their substitutes, reserve goalkeeper Liam Northwood was sent on up front for the final 20 minutes - his first appearance as an outfield player in his career.

Things turned against Oaks again six minutes before half-time when Ryan Sawyer was sent off for handball after stopping Kwesi Ntim's shot on the line - Andre Date stepping up to make it 1-1 from the spot.

McCleod limped off only two minutes after the restart adding to Oaks, before defender George Hedley headed in the visitors second just before the hour.
Gray who replaced Howlett-Mundle was then forced off - but there was still time for the under pressure Oaks to create one more chance in stoppage-time to take it to a spot-kick decider - Albangbee's cross creating problems, only for Josh Wisson to blast over

from eight yards out.
